Application Requirements for Associate and Undergraduate Levels

- Be a full-time student.
- To have continued education for at least one semester.
- Current GPA must be **at least 2.20/4.00** at associate and undergraduate level.
- If the courses to be taken within the scope of Erasmus+ student mobility are conducted in a language other than English, the student must possess and certify proficiency in that language at the minimum level required by the host institution.
- Double major students may apply for and participate in the Erasmus+ exchange program through only one of their majors during a single application period.
- Students currently enrolled in English or Turkish language preparatory programs, as well as scientific preparatory programs, are not eligible to apply for Erasmus+ exchange programs.
- Students with a frozen registration cannot carry out mobility during the semester(s) they are on leave. However, they are permitted to apply for mobility during this period.
- The total duration of Erasmus+ student mobility (including studies and traineeships) within the same education level (undergraduate, graduate, or doctorate) cannot exceed **12 months** in total. This limit includes any prior participation in the 2014-2020 and 2021-2027 Erasmus+ periods, as well as Erasmus Mundus grants, even if the student is non-funded (zero-grant). For integrated programs (such as integrated PhDs) or long-term single-cycle programs (such as Medicine), the total duration cannot exceed **24 months**.

Application Requirements for Postgraduate Levels

- Be a full-time student.
- Current GPA must be **at least 2.50/4.00** at associate and undergraduate level.
- Graduate students who have not yet established a CGPA in their current program may apply using their previous graduation GPA (undergraduate or master's), if they submit the necessary supporting documentation.
- If the courses to be taken within the scope of Erasmus+ student mobility are conducted in a language other than English, the student must possess and certify proficiency in that language at the minimum level required by the host institution.
- Research assistants must obtain written approval from their respective department heads or unit managers at the time of application.
- Students currently enrolled in English or Turkish language preparatory programs, as well as scientific preparatory programs, are not eligible to apply for Erasmus+ exchange programs.
- Students with a frozen registration cannot carry out mobility during the semester(s) they are on leave. However, they are permitted to apply for mobility during this period.
- Master's (with thesis) and PhD students who have not yet completed their credited or non-credited course load must obtain the positive opinion of their thesis supervisor and the head of the department, followed by a decision from the Institute Administrative Board, to participate in Erasmus+ exchange programs.

- The total duration of Erasmus+ student mobility (including studies and traineeships) within the same education level (undergraduate, graduate, or doctorate) cannot exceed **12 months** in total. This limit includes any prior participation in the 2014-2020 and 2021-2027 Erasmus+ periods, as well as Erasmus Mundus grants, even if the student is non-funded (zero-grant). For integrated programs (such as integrated PhDs) or long-term single-cycle programs (such as Medicine), the total duration cannot exceed **24 months**.

Application Process and Important Considerations

- Applications must be submitted via <https://turnaportal.ua.gov.tr/> using e-devlet authentication.
- All students are required to upload a **verifiable transcript with a QR code**. Transcripts can be obtained through the OIS system or e-devlet. Please note that "Preview" versions of transcripts from OIS will **not** be accepted.
- It is mandatory to check the nomination/application deadlines, course offerings, course descriptions, and specific document requirements (e.g., language certificates) of your preferred universities. Host institutions reserve the right to change their admission requirements. Monitoring these updates is the **sole responsibility of the applicant**. You are strongly advised to review the official websites of your target institutions.
- Being placed in a university through the internal selection process does **not guarantee** an official acceptance letter from the host institution. The host university reserves the final right to reject any mobility application.
- The right to participate in the Erasmus+ student mobility for a specific academic year cannot be deferred to a subsequent academic year.
- As this is a **second call for applications**, quotas filled during the first call are unavailable. We strongly recommend that students utilize all **three (3) preferences** and review the final evaluation results of the Fall semester call before submitting.
- All documents uploaded to the application system must be in **PDF format**

Which Institutions Have an Agreement with My Department?

- Applications are accepted exclusively for institutions that have a valid bilateral agreement with the student's registered department/program.
- The list of inter-institutional agreements is subject to be updated until the application system is open.
- Institutions whose quotas were filled during the first call will not be available for selection in this period.

How Can I Receive a Grant?

- Students participating in the mobility are eligible for a grant for a maximum duration of **5 months**.
- The grant amount is calculated based on the mobility dates specified in the official **Acceptance Letter** provided by the host institution.
- The current quota for funded participants is **6**; however, this number is subject to increase based on budget availability and financial planning.
- The highest-scoring student from each faculty will be prioritized for grant support.
- Should there be remaining funds, grants will be allocated to the highest-scoring students across the university, regardless of their faculty.
- Please note that Erasmus+ grants are intended as **financial support** to contribute to your expenses and are not designed to cover the full cost of your stay.

Will I Receive Travel Support?

- In addition to the monthly individual support grant, travel expenses are also supported.
- The distance between the point of origin (**Istanbul**) and the host city is determined using the **Distance Calculator** provided by the European Commission. The grant amount corresponding to the distance band in the table below represents a **round-trip** total (it is not multiplied by two).

- As a rule, participants are expected to use low-emission means of transport for distances under 500 km. Green travel refers to the use of low-carbon emission public transportation, such as buses, trains, or carpooling. To qualify for Green Travel support, sustainable transport must be used for both the departure and return journeys, covering more than half of the total travel distance.
- Students/graduates who choose eco-friendly travel options are eligible for a one-time additional top-up grant of **50 Euro**.
- Additional individual support grants will be provided for travel time before and after the activity; a maximum of **two (2) days** for standard travel and up to **six (6) days** in the case of Green Travel.

How is the Selection Score Calculated?

Simultaneous application for two mobility types (reduction applied to the student's preferred type)	-10 points
Failure to attend mandatory orientation/meetings without a valid excuse (applies to future applications)	-5 points
Failure to attend the language exam without a valid excuse after declaring participation (applies to future applications)	-5 points

¹In addition to combat veterans and their spouses/children, as well as the spouses/children of war martyrs; priority is given to the spouses and children of public officials who were injured, disabled, or killed while performing their duties at home or abroad as a result of terrorist acts (pursuant to Article 21 of the Anti-Terror Law No. 3713, dated 12/4/1991). Furthermore, pursuant to Article 7 of Decree Law (KHK) No. 667 dated July 23, 2016, civilians who lost their lives or became disabled due to the coup attempt and terrorist acts on July 15, 2016 (and their subsequent related actions), along with their spouses and children, shall be prioritized for Erasmus+ student mobility applications.

²To qualify for prioritization, students must submit a "Disability Health Board Report" as specified in the "Regulation on Disability Assessment for Adults" published in the Official Gazette No. 30692 dated February 20, 2019.

³To qualify for prioritization, students must submit an official document from the Ministry of Family and Social Policies stating that they are subject to a protection, care, or housing order pursuant to Law No. 2828.

Is There Any Additional Grant Support?

- In addition to their base grant, participants with limited financial means may be provided with additional grant support. To qualify, participants must be identified as economically or socially disadvantaged within the following sub-categories:
 - Those covered by **Law No. 2828** (under protection, care, or housing orders by the Ministry of Family and Social Services)
 - Students under protection, care, or housing orders within the scope of **Child Protection Law No. 5395**
 - Those receiving orphan's/death benefits and whose parents have no other income.
 - Children of martyrs or veterans
 - Individuals receiving financial livelihood support (a document proving that the student or their parents/guardians receive financial aid from municipalities or public institutions such as Ministries, Social Assistance and Solidarity Foundations, KIZILAY, AFAD, etc., is sufficient)
 - Individuals with disabilities¹
 - Students receiving disability or livelihood support under **Law No. 2022** dated 01.07.1976²
 - Students or their first-degree relatives who have received disaster relief from **AFAD**.
- KYK scholarships, merit-based scholarships, and one-time emergency aids are **not** considered within the scope of the financial aid mentioned above.
- Students meeting the criteria above will be provided with the following additional amounts, provided they request it and submit supporting documentation:

What is Inclusion Support?

- The Erasmus+ Program encourages the participation of individuals with special needs. A person with special needs is a potential participant whose physical, mental, or health-related condition is such that their participation in the mobility activity would not be possible without extra financial support. In order to provide additional grants for inclusion support, the University must request extra funding from the **Turkish National Agency**.
